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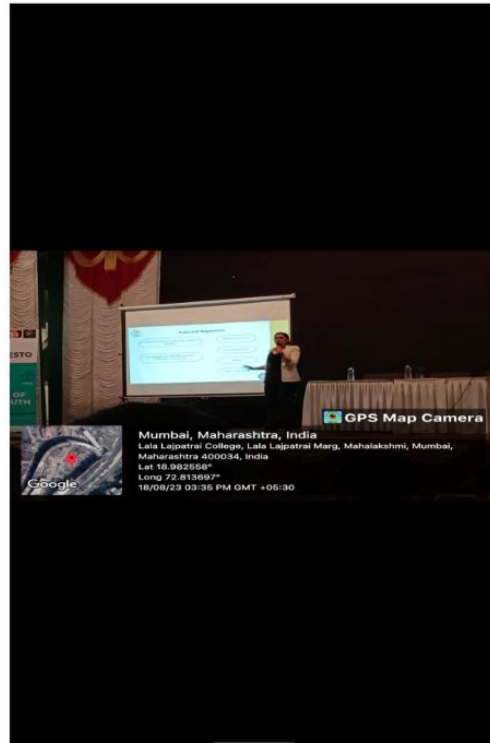

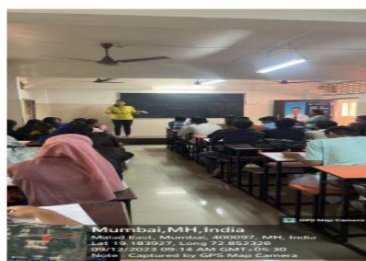


SEMINAR ON Career in the Food and Beverage Industry September 12, 2023,

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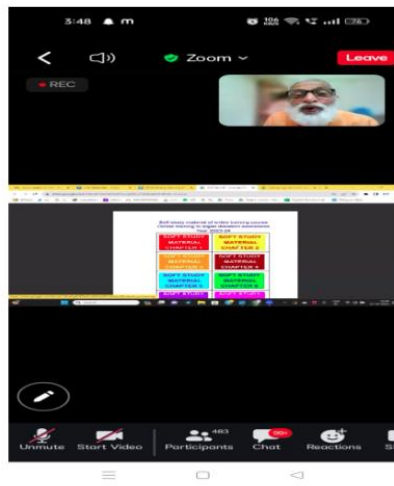
